Australia takes back the Bottle Shop - The Rum Baron's Report

Early in November I attended the Australian Distillers Association Annual General Meeting. The meeting was held at the Margaret River Distillery; the very new and impressive venture by Cameron Symes, (owner/distiller of Limeburners and Tiger Snake whisky in Albany). There was an eclectic attendance of independent distillers from all over country, including the old guard such as Sullivan's Cove in Tasmania and Spike Desert from the Ord River Rum Company in Kununurra; and some new front runners such as Starward, from Essendon and 4 Pillars from Sydney. There was also some young, fresh faces from Archie Rose Distillery, and WA's own Whipper Snapper and Hippocampus Metropolitan Distilleries.

Talking to these people I found we are all of the same mind – getting Australian spirits into the bottle shop! There is a growing body of Australian distillers producing high quality Australian spirits with range encompasses everything from vodkas and gins to rums and whiskies and many more creations in between. Currently the Australian bottle shop offers a wide selection of Australian wine and beer, though the spirit selection consists largely of internationals. While international spirits are of great quality and there is strong established brand loyalty, our own backyard is offering some world class spirits. It reminds me of the wine industry some 15 to 20 years ago. International wine used to dominate here in Australia, and the bottle shop would carry a small selection of Australian wines. Nowadays the Australian wine section is the vast majority of any bottle shop, and our wine regions have grown exponentially. Overseas Australia has become synonymous with fantastic wine regions to rival that of France, Spain and California.

Wouldn't it be great if in 15 to 20 years time Australia gains that recognition for our spirits?

We are at the start of something great in our industry. There are now over 50 independent distilleries in Australia. There is also a growing interest in new, local and craft spirits by the Australian consumer. We want to see it grow

and get experimental. We want to make great Australian products for Australian bottle shops. We want to put Australian spirits on the global map. And when I say 'we' and 'our' I don't just mean 'us' the company, but you the consumer. We may make the stuff, but we make it for you. We make if for you to share and enjoy. Without that, we do not exist. Next time you are in a bottle shop ask if they carry any Australian spirits, and if they don't, ask why not. If you are already a Canefire drinker, why not see what Whipper Snapper has to offer? If you like rum but love whisky, chase down a bottle of Starward whisky.

If you want to try something uniquely Australian why not have a go at Tasi pepper berry liqueur from Lark Distillery?

There has never been a more exciting time in Australian spirit production, and you lucky people are the ones who get to reap the benefit. So dive in and have a drink.

Monsoon Rum Balls

Ingredients:
250g ginger biscuits
250g plain biscuits (i.e. Marie)
1/2 cup coconut
395g condensed milk
3 tbs cocoa
6 tbs Canefire
1 tbs chocolate sprinkles, to coat

Method:

Crush biscuits in food processor until crumbly but not powdered.

Add biscuit crumbs, coconut and cocoa to a large mixing bowl and combine.

Add condensed milk and Canefire, and mix.

Roll mixture into little balls and roll in coconut or chocolate sprinkles.

A Rum Reunion

It has been 10 YEARS since The Kimberley Rum Company made the Swan Valley its home away from home at the Great Northern Distillery. In celebration of over a decade in distilling our Master Distiller was commissioned to release a



micro-blend of Rums across two generations of Distillers.

The first Rum, aged no less than 12 years, was put to barrel by the original Master Distiller and cofounder Rohan Passmore back in 2003. A heavily oaked Rum with deep caramel and earthy undertones.

The second Rum, aged no less than 8 years, was one of the first Rums put to barrel by current Master Distiller Ryan Passmore under the careful eye of his father in early 2007. Capturing a young, zesty profile with slightly sharper top-end flavours.

Carefully blended, these two rums form a robust balance of character truly unique to Canefire.

To commemorate this auspicious milestone we invited a mix of local Distillers, Winemakers, Small Batch Members and Advocates to an evening of all things Rum. Guests were invited to sample previous Batches, trade Canefire stories and rub shoulders with key players in this burgeoning boutique spirit market. Guests were also given the opportunity to sample, and purchase, the long anticipated release of Small Batch 10 before the general public issue.

Among the dignitaries were Codie Palmer, founder and Distiller of the upcoming Illegal Tender Distilling Company in Dongara and James Young from Wild Swan Distilling Co in the Swan Valley; quietly trading top secret techniques in the artisan craft of Rummaking.

As the sun set over The Valley the guests congregated for the highlight of the evening; our first ever Reserve Rum Auction. Signed by both Distillers and accompanied with a hip-flask (for tasting) and a certificate of authenticity, this prize caught many discerning eyes. Bidding was fierce between several parties with a dark house riding in late to push the bid past the thousand dollar mark but the Lennane gang, long time Canefire enthusiasts, would not give up. The final bid came in at whopping \$1250 with all proceeds going to the YWCA's Encore Program.

When given the good news, Cathy Stubbs of Encore Perth, was excited by the prospect of increasing Encores programs from 12 to 16 in 2016. Encore runs an 8 week exercise program for women with breast cancer, said Cathy, relying on the help of volunteers and state funding. Having met and spoken with several of these volunteers and participants of the program it is clear to see the donation will have a profound impact on the community.
