On a recent holiday to Japan, our communications chief was lucky enough to attend a tour of the Suntory Yamazaki whiskey distillery.

The Yamazaki Distillery, operated by the Suntory company and the first distillery in Japan, is set against the foothills of the Omine Mountain Range about 30km south of Kyoto.

Suntory take considerable pride in the long history of their first facility.

From the original century old still, to the barrels in the cavernous aging warehouse that date back to 1923, the tour of the facility is like stepping back in time.

Every aspect of the facility reflects the meticulous care taken by Suntory and it oozes style and sophistication. The layout of the distillery includes a waterfall and peaceful garden, and a wonderful museum that showcases the 100 years of Suntory's history.

And with the tour, which includes whiskey tasting costing just 1000 yen (about \$11 AUD), there's no excuse not to take in a taste of Japan's fascinating history of distilling, the next time you visit the land of the rising sun.



### 5 Tips For a Better Beard

# Warm Banana Split with Canefire sauce

# Wakes 2

**INGREDIENTS** 

3 tbsp. butter

6 tbsp. brown sugar

4 small just ripe bananas, peeled, cut in half lengthwise

1/4 cup Canefire Rum

1 tsp. vanilla essence

Pinch nutmeg

Vanilla ice cream

Fresh Strawberries

Crushed Nuts

Whipped Cream

Preparation

Over medium high heat, melt butter.

Add brown sugar.

Cook and stir until brown sugar dissolves.

Add bananas.

Continue to cook until brown sugar mix caramelizes and bananas are tender; about 2 to 3 minutes.

Remove pan from heat and add rum.

Transfer pan back on heat. To flambé, ignite with long match or barbecue lighter.

The alcohol should burn off in a few seconds and the flame will extinguish. (If flame does not extinguish, cover pan with lid.)

Finish sauce with vanilla and pinch nutmeg.

Serve bananas and rum sauce over vanilla ice cream.

Garnish as desired, with strawberries, crushed nuts, whipped cream.



# **Fetch the Hammer and Blowtorch**

Welcome back to the third installment of our in-depth look at the wonderful world of amateur Cooperage.

In previous articles we looked at repairing splits, cracks and soaking.

So fetch your hammer and blow torch because this issue we're talking about loose bands and waxing.

A slipped band is easy to repair.

First make sure your barrel is hydrated, otherwise it could easily split or crack.

Take a cold chisel and give it a few taps towards the middle of the barrel.

Work your way gently around the circumference, tapping the bands back in place one small blow at a time until it's nice and tight. Remember to rehydrate the barrel again to ensure the leaking has stopped.

If you're not confident hammering picks into your baby there is another simpler less intrusive approach; it requires a blowtorch and some paraffin wax.

A handheld disposable propane cylinder blow torch can be sourced from any hardware store and paraffin wax can be purchased by the kilogram from most soap/candle craft stores.

With hot soapy water gently clean away the stains around the leak.

Break off a chunk of wax and rub it across the troubled area like you're waxing a surfboard; the coarse grain of the oak will pick up the wax. Sweep the blowtorch across the wax to melt it into the grooves (and leaks), careful not to scald the wood. Repeat the process several times for a consistent effect. For those extra hard to reach places melt some wax in an old pot and paint it on. Rehydrate and check to make sure those leaks are plugged!

Try to aim for a 3 to 6 cm radius around the suspect area for good coverage but resist the temptation to cover the entire barrel. We want your baby to breathe! And waxing will make it not only leak tight but air tight.
